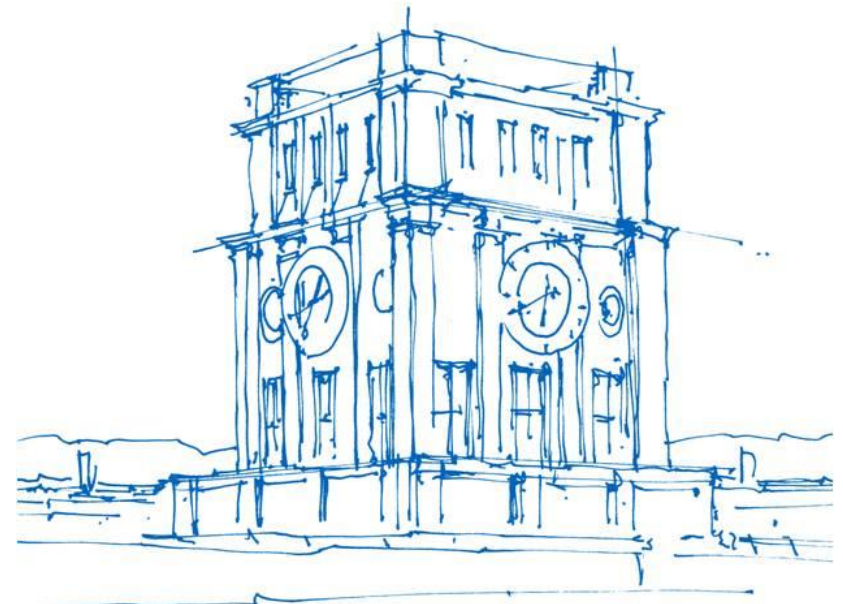

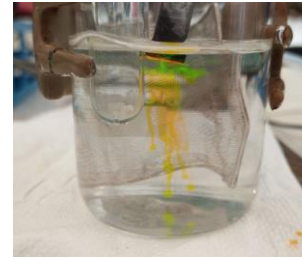

Courses and Research Internship

Research internship also possible during Erasmus SMS:

2 courses to fulfill 10 ECTS requirement + internship



Internship can be organized (via mail) before even applying for the exchange

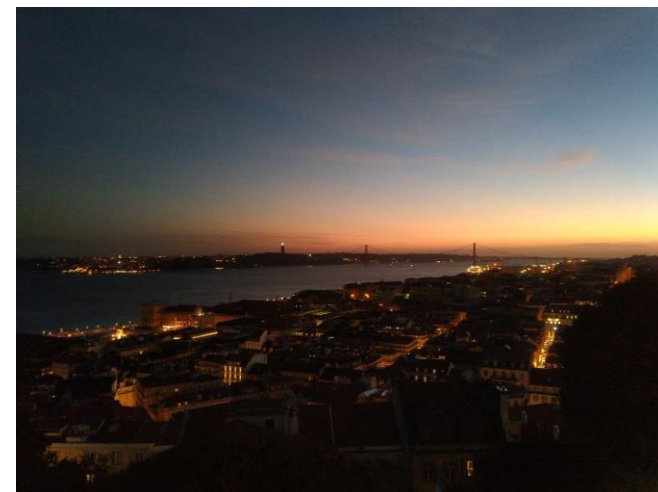
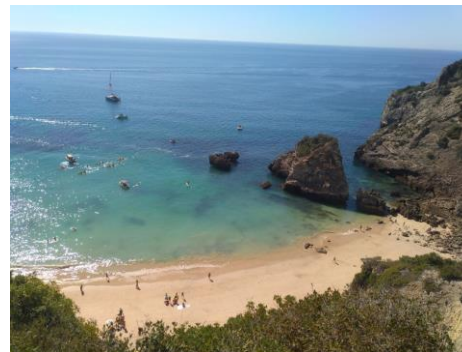
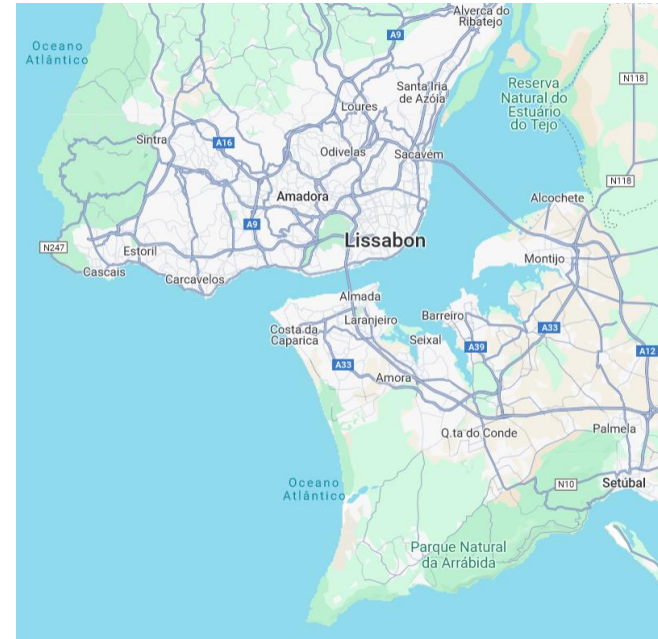
Can be part of the learning agreement, but I would actually not recommend that because of the deadlines, that come with it; TUM-internal supervisor needed anyway

Course choice is rather limited and so is the equivalence to TUM courses;
recommendable to keep credits open in 'Advanced Chemical Subjects'

Continuous evaluation (optional): several smaller exams and a group work instead of one final exam; reduces study effort a lot

Level: rather easy, but the highest grade is usually not awarded by the professors;
18/20 is already very good, but converts only to a 1.6, so expect lower grades

Green Travel

Bus and train possible (e.g. Interrail)

More expensive than flying

Green Travel Grant (higher travel cost grant (28-195€ extra depending on distance); up to four additional funded days) probably does not fully make up for that

Due to the TUM funding regulations with cutoffs, the additional funded days are worthless, unless the extended official duration of your stay brings you over the threshold to receive more funding

Chance to visit cities on the way, e.g. Paris, Lyon, Barcelona, Madrid
